Services

Subcontracts

• All 2021/22 subcontracts are executed for this year.

Health Education

• The Senior Health Education Specialist (SHES) updated the curriculum to present to Ryan White Medical Case Management (MCM) clients on HIV/STD transmission and prevention education. Services were provided in English and Spanish and were offered during psychosocial support groups and on a one-on-one basis to clients referred by their MCMs. The SHES created a curriculum to provide our MCM clients with COVID-19 prevention education and healthy living to be provided on a one-on-one basis via phone or computer. A total of 131 clients were contacted; of those who responded, 66 received health education services and a CleanKit (a kit containing PPE, home sanitation supplies, and written information on COVID-19 prevention in English or Spanish). An additional 11 clients received the CleanKit only.



Education, Prevention and Testing Program

- 1. HOME is where the SWAB is...: we continue to offer contactless, home-based HIV/STI testing via self-swabs and condom/lube delivery service to community members during the COVID-19 response. Please see the service description on our webpages: https://cchealth.org/std/. Since April 2020, we have provided services to 96 unduplicated clients. Of the total clients, 74 or 85% identify as male and 22 or 23% as female, including one transgender woman. Of the male identified individuals, 64 or 86% are MSM. In regard to race/ethnicity, 44 or 46% are Latinx, 22 or 23% African American, 22 or 23% White, and 8 or 8% Asian and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islanders. Of the total clients, 15 clients have tested positive for GC/CT and we have linked them to care.
- 2. Line List intervention: We are continuing to call community residents who have tested positive for chlamydia and/or gonorrhea, including coinfected PLWHIV to make sure that they have received their treatment and understand how to prevent any future reinfection. During the COVID-19 response, the list is shorter but these follow-up calls are crucial to ensure appropriate follow-up care and reduce risky behaviors. We are also offering the HOME is where the SWAB is program services to these clients and their sexual/needle sharing partners.





3. State Condom Access Program: We continue to make sure that county clinics, community-based organizations, and needle exchange sites are well stocked during the pandemic. We are also supplying our needle exchange subcontractor with PPE for their staff and clients.
